Rules Of Procedure

"Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail at the Annual Meeting."
--Constitution of the West Stafford Church, Art. XII., Sect. B, Item 1h.

From "Robert's Rules of Order":

Following the Agenda: "If it is

"If it is desired to transact business out of its order, it is necessary to suspend the rules, which can be done by a two-thirds

vote."

Conducting Business:

"Before any subject is open to debate it is necessary, first, that a motion be made by a member who has obtained the floor; second, that it be seconded; and third, that it be stated by the

moderator."

Debate:

"Each member has the right to speak twice on the same question ... but cannot make a second speech on the same question as long as any member who has not spoken on that question desires the floor. Debate must be limited to the merits of the immediately pending questions."

The Previous Question:

"The form of this motion is, 'I move the previous question!'. As it cannot be debated or amended, it must be voted on immediately ... the effect of ordering the previous question is to close debate immediately, and to bring the assembly at once to a vote on the immediately pending question."

General Consent:

"Business can be expedited greatly by avoiding the formality of motions and voting in routine business and on questions of routine importance, the chair assuming general consent until someone objects."

Voting by Ballot:

"Where the by-laws do not require the vote to be by ballot, it can be so ordered by majority vote, or by general consent."

Acceptance of Reports:

"If the report contains only a statement of fact for the information of the assembly, the reporting member makes no motion for its disposal, as there is no necessity for action on the report. But, if any action is taken, the proper motion, which should be made by someone else, is to accept the report, which has the effect of endorsing the report and making the assembly assume responsibility for it. If it is a financial report ... and when the auditing committee reports, this report should be accepted, which carries with it the endorsement of the financial report. If the report contains recommendations ... the proper motion is to adopt the recommendations."

To Defer Action:

(a)Postpone to a Certain Time. If it is desired to defer action upon a question till a particular time, the proper motion to make is "to postpone it to that time." (b) Lay on the Table. Instead of postponing a question to a particular time, it may be desired to lay it aside temporarily until some other question is disposed of, retaining the privilege of resuming its consideration at any time. The only way to accomplish this is to move that the question "lie on the table".

Recommended by the Conference Parliamentarian:

Amendments in Writing:

Members proposing amendments to motions, resolutions, reports, or recommendations shall submit the amendments in writing to the clerk at the time the amendment is moved.

Minutes of 1990 Annual Meeting

Annual Meeting Second Congregational Church of Stafford at West Stafford January 28, 1990

I. Call the Meeting to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 PM, January 28, 1990 by Church Clerk Kenneth May.

II. Reading of the Call

The call to the meeting was read by Church Clerk Kenneth May.

III. Determination of Quorum

The Clerk stated membership to be 194; a quorum would be twenty members. Following a count, which resulted in twenty-six members present, the Clerk declared a quorum present.

IIIa. Election of Moderator Pro-Tem

A motion was made and seconded that Jack Richens serve as Moderator Pro-Tem. The motion was passed on a voice vote.

IV. Opening Worship

Rev. Virginia Doherty opened our meeting by reading a passage of scripture and offering a prayer.

V. Determination of Voting Procedure

The Moderator stated his intention to follow Robert's Rules and the Rules of Procedure as published. A motion was made and seconded to follow those procedures and approved by vote.

VI. Adoption of Minutes of the 1989 Annual Meeting

A motion was made and seconded to approve the 1989 Annual Meeting minutes as printed. Approved.

- V. Treasurer John Leavitt gave an overview of the Treasurers report.

 Typographical errors were corrected. Myron Davis inquired as to where the many small trust fund monies were invested. Since David Salsbury has those records, a report will be prepared and presented to Church Council. After a motion and second, the Treasurers report as corrected was accepted by vote.
- IX. Nominating Committee Report Cindy Lingley presented the committee's report. Changes included substituting Alma Tetro for Lee Kerr on Ways & Means, and the resignation of Bette Anderson from Diaconate.
- X. Election of Officers, Boards and Committees

 Nominations from the floor filled the vacant positions. After a motion and second, it was voted to close nominations. Since there were only single candidates for all positions, a motion and second to have the cast one ballot for the slate was approved.
- XI. Adoption of the 1990 Budget

Treasurer John Leavitt gave an overview of the proposed budget against 1989 actual expenditures. Minor corrections were made to the printed proposed budget. A motion was made and seconded to increase the salaries of the secretary, custodian and organist by 5%. These monies would be shifted from the line-item for pulpit search committee. Following discussion a motion was made and seconded to amend the above motion to also increase the pastor's salary by 5%, with the monies coming from the same line item. After extensive discussion, the question was called. The vote on calling the question was approved. A paper ballot was requested. The vote on the amendment was 18-8-0. The vote on the amended motion was 19-8-0. After the adjusted numbers were announced by the clerk, a vote was taken on the amended budget package. This passed on a unanimous voice vote.

Recess

After the meeting was reconvened, the Moderator announced that Diaconate, Trustees and Council did not make quorum to elect officers.

XII. Old Business

None.

XIII. New Business

A motion was made and seconded to instruct Church Council to form a committee for the purpose of investigating and auditioning organs that might be suitable to replace our organ when it fails, and provide a report containing recommendations. This would be used when it became necessary to replace the organ. It was approved.

XIV. Closing Worship

Rev. Virginia Doherty led a brief closing prayer.

Adjournment

The 1990 Annual Meeting of the Second Congregational Church of Stafford at West Stafford was adjourned at 3:00 PM.

In 1990 many projects that were voted on in 1989 reached completion. We feel that the properties and monies of the church have been carefully tended.

Major Issues This Year

- 1. New furnace installed in the Parish House.
- 2. Joe Perko hired as custodian.
- 3. Had a new rear deck and door installed on the Parish House.
- 4. Two sodium vapor lights and timer installed at church.
- 5. Installed new fire escape on rear of the Church.
- 6. Installed new wheel chair ramp and door on west side of the church.
- 7. We are now using a new water softener with a filter replacing a salt activated system which pollutes the ground.
- 8. Received approximately \$22,500 from the Clarence Benton estate; plan to put the money in a Certificate of Deposit.
- 9. Electric heat installed in the Pastor's office. Now we do not have to heat the entire Parish House to heat the Pastor's office.
- 10. Sold Prudential Bache Securities #45-1001344565 for approximately \$60,000.00. Money to be invested in Certificate of Deposit paying highest interest.
- 11. Accepted Sue Leavitt's resignation as organist and hired Jim Tripoli to fill this vacancy beginning January 1, 1991.
- 12. Made proposed budget for use of Stewardship Committee.
- 13. Made actual budget for Annual Meeting.
- 14. Initiated two workdays one spring, one fall.
- 15 Painted rear deck of Parish House, fire escape and wheel chair ramp.
- 16. New P.A. system installed in sanctuary.

Pastoral Relations Committee

The Pastoral Relations Committee met eight times during the year. In July we started to review the financial package for next year. We met with Rev. Doherty and spoke about her expenses and read a letter from the Tolland Association about her contract. We reviewed her performance by reviewing the Pastor's reports to Church Council from January to May and the feedback the committee had from the congregation. Items of dissatisfaction received from members were: 1) no children's word during the summer months; 2) the show of peace at the start of the service; 3) failure of the pastor to recognize people; 4) failure of the pastor to attend meetings; 5) dissatisfaction with the order of worship; 6) the pastor doesn't attend coffee fellowship; 7) the pastor does not preach from the pulpit; 8) the pastor acts like a priest. These concerns were presented to us by four members of the congregation with two of the four being husband and wife.

Our evaluation process involved examining her performance in five categories: preaching, youth and children, compassion, visitation, and crisis management. Below is a summary of our evaluation of these five categories:

Pastoral Relations [Con't]

Preaching:

We were most satisfied with sermon content and its appropriate relation to scripture is to be commended. Perhaps the only shortcoming is the Pastor's desire to preach among the congregation rather than from the pulpit. The style appears not to be appreciated or desired by the congregation. Comment: Rev. Doherty never left the pulpit after we spoke about this.

Youth and Children:

Content of the Children's Chat is appropriate and suitable. It is desirable that the chats continue throughout the summer break. More involvement or direction is desirable in dealing with our teens.

Compassion:

Based on feedback, however limited, Rev. Doherty has a unique compassion when dealing with the personal problems of members of our congregation.

Visitation:

Rev. Doherty definitely exceeds our expectations on visitation when associated with illness or hospitalization. Some effort is to be extended on promoting social visitation.

Crisis Management:

In dealing with personal crisis of our members, Rev. Doherty is outstanding. Our concern centers on what may be perceived as a church crisis. In this respect it is desirable that Rev. Doherty develop a methodology for dealing with the dissatisfaction expressed by the members, either directly to her, or through members of the committee.

At the October 23rd Rev. Doherty reported that she was receiving complaints from some members of the congregation in vicious, rude and sometimes obscene fashion. A list of the items was discussed. It was agreed that a special meeting of the Church Council should be called to address these issues. That meeting was held on October 25th.

On Sunday, November 11th Rev. Doherty asked for another Pastoral Relations Committee meeting. At that meeting she announced that she had been in contact with Ginny King and that Ginny was fully aware of the difficulties occurring at West Stafford. Rev. Doherty also stated that although she had hoped that the emergency Church Council meeting would improve the situation, in fact the harassment had escalated, to the point that callers were questioning the existence of her credentials. Based on this continued harassment, Rev. Doherty announced that she was terminating her ministry at West Stafford, effective immediately. Strong disappointment was expressed by all present.

It was discussed that from now on better communication and more specific definition of the pastors and committees duties and responsibilities were required as well as a formal defined path of information flow.

Generally the informal structure of the church needs to be controlled and complaints and problems should be channeled to appropriate committees. The committees should address the issue, and communicate with the concerned member regarding the committees decision.

The termination package requested by the Pastoral Relations Committee consisted of a one-time payment of \$30,000.00 was submitted to the Trustees. It was further recommended by Ginny King that the members of this committee remain active to help the church get through this period.

The summer services were supported with special music provided by Bob, Jim and Nancy Tripoli, Ken May as well as me. The highlight of summer worship is always the Sun Valley service where Kim Grotheer and her friend Ruth sing and accompany themselves on the guitar.

The fall was filled with many musical opportunities where the Junior Choir sang several times and both choirs participated in the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service at the Stafford Springs Congregational Church. The Advent and Christmas Season was filled with lots of special music which both choirs and individuals had worked very hard to not only learn but live musically the essence. One very special event was a prelude duet that I had the privilege to play with Mildred Calchera. Mildred is our former organist who is 85 years old and still finds music is a very vital part of her life. On Christmas Eve the church was filled with lessons and carols sung by the choirs and congregation. The prelude was a special offering if a clarinet trio by Ken May, Tara Tupper and Tom Greaser, one of our dinner guests! Included in the service was a solo by Kate Tripoli, and anthem for the two choirs, and the Junior Choir anthem accompanied by a clarinet obbligato performed by Tara. Christmas Eve would never be complete for me without the beautiful anthem which Jim has written "Holy Virgin Mother" sung by Nancy, accompanied by Jim.

During the fall a very heavy decision weighed upon me. I found it difficult to consider all the Sundays it would be necessary for me to be away from the church due to my mother's illness and the responsibilities I have as a parent of a child approaching college. I was also having some difficulty in dealing with the issues of the church at the time so I found myself considering resigning many times. The thought of leaving my musical church family was a difficult one for me, but one with which I am very pleased at this point. 




