## Rules Of Procedure

"Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail at the Annual Meeting."
--Constitution of the West Stafford Church, Art. XII., Sect. B. Item 1h.

## From "Robert's Rules of Order":

Following the Agenda: "If it is desired to transact business out of its order, it is

necessary to suspend the rules, which can be done by a two-thirds

vote."

Conducting Business: "Before any subject is open to debate it is necessary, first,

that a motion be made by a member who has obtained the floor; second, that it be seconded; and third, that it be stated by the

moderator."

<u>Debate</u>: "Each member has the right to speak twice on the same question

... but cannot make a second speech on the same question as long as any member who has not spoken on that question desires the floor. Debate must be limited to the merits of the immediately

pending questions."

The Previous Question: "The form of this motion is, 'I move the previous question!'. As

it cannot be debated or amended, it must be voted on immediately ... the effect of ordering the previous question is to close debate immediately, and to bring the assembly at once to a vote

on the immediately pending question."

General Consent: "Business can be expedited greatly by avoiding the formality of

motions and voting in routine business and on questions of routine importance, the chair assuming general consent until

someone objects."

oting by Ballot: "Where the by-laws do not require the vote to be by ballot, it

can be so ordered by majority vote, or by general consent."

Acceptance of Reports: "If the report contains only a statement of fact for the

information of the assembly, the reporting member makes no motion for its disposal, as there is no necessity for action on the report. But, if any action is taken, the proper motion, which should be made by someone else, is to accept the report, which has the effect of endorsing the report and making the assembly assume responsibility for it. If it is a financial report ... and

when the auditing committee reports, this report should be accepted, which carries with it the endorsement of the financial report. If the report contains recommendations ... the proper

motion is to adopt the recommendations."

To Defer Action: (a)Postpone to a Certain Time. If it is desired to defer action

upon a question till a particular time, the proper motion to make is "to postpone it to that time." (b) Lay on the Table. Instead of postponing a question to a particular time, it may be desired to lay it aside temporarily until some other question is disposed of, retaining the privilege of resuming its consideration at any

time. The only way to accomplish this is to move that the

question "lie on the table".

# Annual Meeting Second Congregational Church of Stafford at West Stafford January 27, 1991

I. Call the Meeting to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 PM, January 27, 1991 by Moderator Jack Richens.

II. Reading of the Call

The call to the meeting was read by Church Clerk Kenneth May.

III. Determination of Quorum

The Clerk stated membership to be 197; a quorum would be twenty members. Following a count, which resulted in forty-six members present, the Moderator declared a quorum present.

IV. Opening Worship

Kay Myott opened our meeting with worship consisting of a hymn and a prayer.

V. Determination of Voting Procedure

The Moderator stated his intention to follow Robert's Rules and the Rules of Procedure as published. A motion was made and seconded to follow those procedures and approved by vote.

VI. Adoption of Minutes of the 1990 Annual Meeting

A motion was made and seconded to approve the 1990 Annual Meeting minutes as printed. Approved.

VII. Adoption of Agenda and Rules of Procedure

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the Agenda as printed. A motion was made and seconded to amend the Agenda by placing item XII.A. before item VIII. After discussion, the amendment was passed on a voice vote. The amended agenda was then accepted on a vice vote.

XII. New Business

Action upon the Diaconate recommendation for Interim Pastor
Gordon Myott presented the recommendation from the Diaconate the Rev.
Susan DiSimone be selected as Interim Minister. Gordon outlined the
process that the Diaconate followed, and why they are making this
recommendation. After a period of discussion, the recommendation was
presented as a motion, seconded and approved by voice vote.

The number of regular meetings was corrected to eleven and the number of special meetings was corrected to two.

There was some discussion as to whether there were additional pledges to report. There are no new pledges to report. The seventeen unpecified pledges are estimated to total \$4,000.00 if completed at the same level of given as begun in January.

Two questions were raised: the reference in the report to a letter from the Tolland Association elicited an inquiry as to the contents of the letter. Carol Dywer stated that the Association had raised questions concerning parts

of Virginia's contract regarding certain expenses. Also, the reference to "show of peace" in the report generated an inquiry as exactly what that refered to. Carol responded that it refered to the moment during the service when people greet each other and wish each other God's peace.

In response to a question, Clerk Ken May stated that he report was written by him based on a report given to Church Council in October.

P. Historian -

Myron Davis stated that the Annual Report should contain a listing of all the Trust Funds in the care of the Church.

The auditors reported that all the financial reports were audited and found correct. It is noted that that it was Eileen Landry, not Ava Landry, that served as an auditor.

- T. Treasurer John Leavitt gave an overview of the Treasurers report. Questions were raised on two items: 1) the Church Telephone bill was much higher. Trustees should have questioned this. 2) under D34 Building Fund, add transfer to escrow in the amount of \$270.00.

After a motion and second, all reports as printed or as corrected were accepted by vote.

IX. Nominating Committee Report

Motion and second to accept report as printed. The Moderator then asked for voulnteers first, and nominations second, from the floor. Some positions were filled, others not. The report was accepted by vote. Remaining positions will be referred to Nominating Committee.

X. Adoption of 1991 Budget

A motion and second were made to accept the proposed budget as printed. Treasurer John Leavitt gave an overview of what items he expected to come in under budget. The results would produce expected expenditure of \$64,767.15. An amendment was moved and seconded to take the \$64,767.15 amount, remove the salaries of the organist, custodian and secretary at 1990 rates of pay, then calculate an amount of reduction equal to 5% of the balance, giving discretion to the Board of Trustees as to where the reductions will be applied. After discussion with the Treasurer and Clerk, this amount was determined to be \$2,934.18. After the derivation of this amount was explained to the members present, it was discussed. The amendment was defeated by a vote of 13-17-0. A second amendment was moved and seconded to reduce the budget total to \$64,767.15 by reducing the Pastor's salary to \$25,695.29, the Organist's salary to \$3,738.32, and increasing the Pulpit supplies item to \$1.050.00. Under the Receipts area the item for pledges was reduced to \$23,009.79. Following a brief period of discussion, this amendment was passed 28-1-1. The amended budget was then passed on a vote of 28-1-1.

#### Recess

After the meeting was reconvened, the Moderator announced that Diaconate did not make quorum to elect officers. Trustees met and elected Jack Richens Chairman and Lee Kerr secretary. Church Council met and elected Nancy Tripoli to serve as secretary. Church Council will meet the third tuesday of each month. All other Boards and Committees are encouraged to meet during the first two weeks.

XII. New Business

B. New Business from the Floor - a brief discussion was held on the question "Do we want to continue deficit spending?" There was no concensus reached and no request for further consideration.

#### Board Of Christian Education

The Board is made up of six active members. We meet on the second Tuesday of the month. This year the Board held two Special Sundays to givr the teaching staff a few extra mornings to attend the worship service.

Something new was started in September. Instead of recognizing each teacher individually we started recognizing the whole class. Every month one class does a special project for the bulletin board in Fellowship Hall. This shows the congregation what they are learning in Sunday School and shows the children how much they are a part of the church.

## Sunday School Report

An active year for the Sunday School has been completed. The teachers meet the third Sunday of the month after church service. We met ten times last year to discuss curriculum, attendance, programs and problems. Since September all classes up to the sixth grade have used "David C. Cooke" curriculum again this year. Seventh and up started using "Joy" and they are much happier with the change.

# Sunday School Report [Con't]

The children contributed to several projects this year. They gave to Desert Storm families, camperships in our church, the Wellness Clinic and Habitat for Humanity. In the spring they collected Lenten containers (also for camperships) and in the fall they collected for UNICEF. The Sunday School offerings from the children is what makes these projects so successful.

A new policy was set up last year concerning attendance. The policy is a little bit more flexible because it allows a sickness to not be counted as an absence. It also allows faithful attendance to miss four sundays instead of two. We were able to give a lot more pins away on Children's Day which is a good incentive for the Children to come more often. Nine children achieved "Perfect" attendance and thirteen achieved "Faithful" attendance.

On September 25th we held a work night to paint and clean out the Parish House. Twelve people came and we were able to clean out all of the cupboards and paint most of the rooms.

#### Stewardship Committee
