#### Rules Of Procedure

"Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail at the Annual Meeting." -- Constitution of the West Stafford Church, Art. XII., Sect. B, Item 1h.

From "Robert's Rules of Order":

Following the Agenda:

"If it is desired to transact business out of its order, it is necessary

to suspend the rules, which can be done by a two-thirds vote."

Conducting Business:

"Before any subject is open to debate it is necessary, first, that a motion be made by a member who has obtained the floor; second, that

it be seconded; and third, that it be stated by the moderator."

Debate:

"Each member has the right to speak twice on the same question... but cannot make a second speech on the same question as long as any member who has not spoken on that question desires the floor. Debate must be limited to the merits of the immediately pending questions."

The Previous Question:

"The form of this motion is, 'I move the previous question!'. As it cannot be debated or amended, it must be voted on immediately ... the effect of ordering the previous question is to close debate immediately, and to bring the assembly at once to a vote on the immediately pending

question."

General Consent:

"Business can be expedited greatly by avoiding the formality of motions and voting in routine business and on questions of routine importance,

the chair assuming general consent until someone objects."

Voting by Ballot:

"Where the by-laws do not require the vote to be by ballot, it can be

so ordered by majority vote, or by general consent."

Acceptance of Reports:

"If the report contains only a statement of fact for the information of the assembly, the reporting member makes no motion for its disposas there is no necessity for action on the report. But, if any action is taken, the proper motion, which should be made by someone else, is to accept the report, which has the effect of endorsing the report and making the assembly assume responsibility for it. If it is a financial report ... and when the auditing committee reports, this report should be accepted, which carries with it the endorsement of the financial report. If the report contains recommendations ... the proper motion

is to adopt the recommendations."

To Defer Action:

(a)Postpone to a Certain Time. If it is desired to defer action upon a question till a particular time, the proper motion to make is "to postpone it to that time." (b) Lay on the Table. Instead of postponing a question to a particular time, it may be desired to lay it aside temporarily until some other question is disposed of, retaining the privilege of resuming its consideration at any time. The only way to accomplish this is to move that the question "lie on the table".

Recommended by the Conference Parliamentarian:

Amendments in Writing: Members proposing amendments to motions, resolutions, reports, or recommendations shall submit the amendments in writing to the clerk at the time the amendment is moved.

# Annual Meeting Second Congregational Church of Stafford at West Stafford January 26, 1992

I. Call the Meeting to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:01 PM, January 26, 1992 by Moderator Bruce Ladr.

A motion and second were made to accept the proposed budget as printed. Treasurer John. Leavitt gave an overview of the budget. Several questions were raised and answered. The budget was then passed on a voice vote.

XI. Search Committee

A motion was made and seconded to suspend the rules. It was approved by voice vote. Item C of new business was then presented. The candidates for Search Committee were presented as: Peg Ekenbarger, Bill Hassmann, Cindy Meyer, Gordon Myott, Lisa Ray, Jack Richens, Don Sanger, Ruth Anne Talamini and Jim Tripoli. There being no discussion, the Committee was approved on a voice vote.

XII. Old Business

A. There was no Old Business.

#### Recess

After the meeting was reconvened, the Moderator announced that Diaconate elected Ross Kerr as Chairman. Trustees met and elected Jan Glenister and Joe Demars as Co-chairmen. The Search Committee met and elected Jack Richens and Gordon Myott as co-chairmen. Church Council will meet the third Tuesday of each month. All other Boards and Committees are encouraged to meet during the first two weeks.

#### XIII. New Business

- B. Action on proposal to pay off Parsonage mortgage. Tabled until item F. dealt with.
- C. Action on proposal to allow the Trustees to purchase computer equipment for the Church. After discussion, approved.
- D. Action on evaluation of need to continue use of the crossing guard on Sunday mornings. This item was tabled.
- E. Discussion on the desirability of selling the Parsonage and offering a housing allowance to the next pastor in its stead took place. A show of hands indicated that all present would support this action. A motion was made and seconded to have a special meeting to approve this action. It was approved and the meeting scheduled for February 16, 1992.
- F. Action on the proposal to pay off the parsonage mortgage. A motion was made and seconded to address this issue at the special meeting on February 16th. Approved.
- G. New Business from the Floor a question was raised regarding the nominating committee being responsible for finding leaders for Singles/Couples. The subject of Constitution revision was raised, and input requested from church members. A question was raised regarding the financial responsibility of the Missionary Secretary in the event of a loss of funds. John Leavitt will check insurance coverage.

Following another hymn, Susan DeSimone offered another prayer.

### Pastor's Report

During 1992 we have continued to try to preach the good news, carry out Jesus' commandments to love and serve others, and prepare the church for the new pastor.

I led 48 worship services, including special services such as Christmas eve. I have prepared a class of nine for Confirmation; this included a retreat in March. For more than half of the year we had Bible study on Thursday evenings. I have also carried out the usual pastoral services of visiting and counseling, and the pastoral duties of attending board and committee meetings, and responding to parishioners' spiritual needs.

I baptized Danielle Nelson, Andrew Brown, Damion Barsaleau, Raymond Bourque and Shawn Kowalyshyn. I officiated at the wedding of Amy Kaluzewicz and Anthony Deane. I conducted services of celebration and memorial for the lives of Jessey-Wayne Davis and Adam Karkevitch, and committal services for Iris Webster and Dorothy Wilson.

Administration is the great hidden work of pastors. This year we have improved our office workings with the purchase of a computer and creation of a secretary's office from the old storage closet. We hired Mary Griswold to be a 10-hour-a-week secretary and I have been training her this year. We have furnished her office, starting with a donated desk and chair and slowly adding the small necessities such as a Rollodex file. I am the editor of the newsletter by default, but it is produced by many hands, including especially Kim Grotheer who contributes her artistic and layout knowledge each month. I have also sorted out and reorganized files in the pastors' office, particularly those from Rev. Howard Cramer, who did not have the chance to do this himself. (I have also cleaned out the parsonage basement.)

During 1992 I helped organized the national conference of the Interim Ministry Network in Westfield, helped plan the annual meeting of the Connecticut Conference and led its worship services, and began my Doctor of Ministry studies at Hartford Seminary. In other wider church activities, I have attended the monthly meetings of the Stafford Clergy Association, the Tolland Association Clergy, and the meetings the Committee on Interim Ministry and the Department of Stewardship and Mission Interpretation of the Connecticut Conference.

In my monthly reports to church officers, I have focused on the five "developmental tasks" of interim ministry: coming to terms with history, changes in leadership, discovering a new identity, new relationship to the denomination, and commitment to new leadership. Progress in these areas this year is marked by increased mission involvement to help the needy in Stafford, your willingness to consider various ways to provide pastoral housing (selling or keeping the parsonage), strong support for the fund-raising activities of the church this fall, ongoing disclosure and healing of issues from the past, and the deliberate and careful work of the Search Committee.

Continuing strengths in the church include the strong faith and caring actions of many members, a vigorous Sunday School, a music program which is uplifting and artistic, an open and democratic process for making decisions, good communication, and responsible, hardworking church leadership.

Near-term hopes I have for this church are that it would have: more interest in Bible study, greater willingness by members to serve as deacons and trustees, and broader-based stewardship, having the budget balanced by the stewardship of the members instead of drawing on reserves, and a higher salary for the permanent pastor.

The past decade has been a difficult one for this church. You have been tested in this wounding process, and a certain sorting out has taken place. Those of you who have remained faithful to the church and continued to serve it in spite of the setbacks have shown courage and spiritual depth, for it has not been easy. Like the laborers in the vineyard who toiled from early morning until late in the day, you will receive the same "wages" as those who join or return to the church after the new pastor arrives. The church will blossom again, and it will

have been your faithful work through the days of discouragement that will have been the major human ingredient in making this possible.

#### Pastoral Search Committee

The Search Committee was selected by the Nominating Committee to be representative of the congregation and was approved at the Annual Meeting last year. Since that time we've come a long way and while we are as anxious as you are to complete the process we are committed to take the necessary time and steps to make the selection of the best possible candidate.

We started meeting promptly in February, seeking guidance and resource support from the UCC Conference Center in Hartford. We were provided with reference materials to help anothe name of a local pastor, Rev. Robert Hamilton, who recently had completed the search process, to act as our advisor, Rev. Hamilton has provided additional resources of his time, written material and advice on a number of topics as well as leading one meeting to help committee members explore one anothers feelings, background and beliefs to help us bond as a group.

Having bonded we launched into organizational tasks and forming groups by laws to help us conduct our business. With these tasks complete we charged into preparation of the church profile where we had mild nine different opinions plus input from the congregation into a concise statement of what the church stood for, what we want to be and what characteristics we want in a pastor. The profile was complete by the of June and made available for review by the church members and prospective candidates.

Circulation of the profile brought resumes' from pastors by the end of July. During the review process we had disappointing new that one member, Lisa Ray, had to leave the area because of employment opportunities. After careful consideration the committee asked the council that we be allowed to continue with eight remaining members in the interest of group integrity and time. The council agreed and we continued to review pastor resumes'. By the end of October we had received and read 39 profiles and had selected five first choice candidates and eight second choice candidates and decided we needed to deal with these before receiving anymore so we asked the conference center to stop sending resumes' to us.

Interviewing, visits to hear sermons and listening to tapes/videos helped us to evaluate the candidates. At the time of writing this report we are down to two first choice candidates and four second choice candidates. On of our first choice candidates is being pursued by another church and we will not be able to complete our evaluation of that candidate until the first week of February unless that candidate advises acceptance of a call from the other church. Some of the second choice candidates could prove worthy of first choice and evaluation of these candidates could extend into February. The committee is prepared to accept the fact that when all is said and done none of the candidates may accept our call or may not be acceptable to us and we will start the resume' review process again.

At this point we've learned that our profile seems to be positive in the eyes of prospective pastors and Rev. DeSimone's work over the last two years has helped this church deal with important issues of our past and turn these issues into an attraction to candidates considering us.

We've also learned that our willingness to offer a housing allowance gives us flexibility to overcome limitations that the parsonage presents as reported in the Newsletter interest in the parsonage has been minimal so far.

In summary the committee has bonded, worked very hard and seem to be getting very close to a final recommendation, however there is a very real possibility we may have to start over if things don't work our with present selections. The spirits of the committee remain bright and we ask for your prayers in completing this task.

Addendum: Christian Education
