

Rules Of Procedure

"Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail at the Annual Meeting."

Constitution of the West Stafford Church, Art. XII., Sect. B, Item 1h.

From "Robert's Rules of Order":

Following the Agenda:

"If it is desired to transact business out of its order, it is necessary to suspend the rules, which can be

done by a two-thirds vote."

Conducting Business:

Debate:

"Before any subject is open to debate it is necessary, first, that a motion be made by a member who

has obtained the floor; second, that it be seconded; and third, that it be stated by the moderator."

"Each member has the right to speak twice on the same question ... but cannot make a second speech on the same question as long as any member who has not spoken on that question desires the floor.

Debate must be limited to the merits of the immediately pending questions."

The Previous Question:

"The form of this motion is, 'I move the previous question!'. As it cannot be debated or amended, it must be voted on immediately ... the effect of ordering the previous question is to close debate immediately, and to bring the assembly at once to a vote on the immediately pending question."

General Consent:

"Business can be expedited greatly by avoiding the formality of motions and voting in routine business and on questions of routine importance, the chair assuming general consent until someone objects."

Voting by Ballot:

"Where the by-laws do not require the vote to be by ballot, it can be so ordered by majority vote, or by

general consent."

Acceptance of Reports:

"If the report contains only a statement of fact for the information of the assembly, the reporting member makes no motion its disposal, as there is no necessity for action on the report. But, if any action is taken, the proper motion, which should be made by someone else, is to accept the report, which has the effect of endorsing the report and making the assembly assume responsibility for it. If it is a financial report ... and when the auditing committee reports, this report should be accepted, which carries with it the endorsement of the financial report. If the report contains recommendations ... the proper motion is to adopt the recommendations."

To Defer Action:

(a)Postpone to a Certain Time. If it is desired to defer action upon a question till a particular time, the proper motion to make is "to postpone it to that time." (b) Lay on the Table. Instead of postponing a question to a particular time, it may be desired to lay it aside temporarily until some other question is disposed of, retaining the privilege of resuming its consideration at any time. The only way to accomplish this is to move that the question "lie on the table".

Recommended by the Conference Parliamentarian:

Amendments in Writing:

Members proposing amendments to motions, resolutions, reports, or recommendations shall submit the amendments in writing to the clerk at the time the amendment is moved.

Minutes of 2004 Annual Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 1:05 p.m. on January 25, 2004, and the Clerk read the Call to the Annual Meeting. There were 36 members present. We needed 19 members for a quorum.

Opening worship: Ross Kerr conducted an opening worship reading from 1 Corinthians 12, we sang **The Church's** One Foundation (verses 1 & 4), and with a prayer by Sue Leavitt.

Determination of voting procedure:

Motion: Ken May, that voting is conducted by a show of hands.

Seconded: Charlie Bettinger

Vote: unanimous Adoption of minutes:

Motion: Charlie Bettinger, that the minutes be accepted as printed.

Seconded: Suki Garrell Vote: unanimous Amendment of the minutes:

Motion: Ken May, that the minutes from last year include the Church Mission Statement.

Seconded: Charlie Bettinger

Vote: unanimous Adoption of agenda:

Motion: Ken May, that the agenda be accepted as printed.

Seconded: Joe Wadsworth

Vote: unanimous Presentation of reports:

The writer of each report was given an opportunity to make comments or corrections to the printed report.

Linda May made a correction to the Missions report on page 19. The Space Shuttle Mission in March of 2003 should be added under "following offers".

Don Sanger made corrections to the Capital Campaign report on page 21. Cash receipts received for Capital Campaign Fund in 2003 should be \$12,530.60 not \$13,260.00. The total receipts received to date should be \$140,495.66 not \$141,217.16. The amount needed to repay our invested funds should be \$2,227.63 not \$1,506.23. Cash contributions received for Barn and Steeple Fund in 2003 should be \$2,430.00 not \$2,470.00. The total contributions received to date should be \$11,451.97 not \$11,491.97.

John Leavitt reported on behalf of the Auditors that the books have been audited and a few numbers had to be fixed and are amended in the Treasurer's report. These numbers were corrected and all other books were found to be correct.

Ken May spoke to us as Financial Secretary about how the attendance, the number of pledges and the dollar amount of pledges have decreased every year since 1999. However, the total amount of money given to the church over the past five years has stayed relatively the same. The amount of money, through pledges, given to the church has decreased considerably this year.

Don Sanger submitted a revised Treasurer's report that will be attached to the back of the Annual Report.

There were several additions: Sue Leavitt was added as Moderator, Lesley Bourque was added as Clerk, Kim Kowalyshyn was added as Assistant Clerk, Don Sanger and Gibby Paixao were added on Diaconate, Linda May was added on Nominating, John Leavitt was added as an Auditor, Suki Garrell and Dorraine Parker were added as Delegates and Lauren Parker was added as Youth Delegate.

Motion: Charlie Bettinger, to accept Officers and Boards as printed.

Seconded: Lisa May Vote: unanimous Adoption of proposed budget:

Motion: Charlie Bettinger, to accept the 2004 Budget as printed with change.

Seconded: John Leavitt Vote: unanimous

Bill Hassman went over the proposed budget and made a change on the second line of disbursements under Funding of Sabbatical. Under 2003 Actual, it should be \$3,200.00 not \$1,000.00.

Old Business:

Sue Leavitt thanked the congregation for supporting the Contemporary Worship Service. They will not continue the service because the mission they set out for was to get younger people to come to the church and it did not work.

A ten-minute recess was taken.

Sue Leavitt mentioned that she would like our church goals to include something about our spiritual growth.

Motion: Gibby Paixao, to have a celebration for our 240th Church Anniversary.

Vote: 33 votes in favor and 1 not in favor.

A discussion was held. Gibby suggested that we work with the Lions who will be having a Fall Festival. Gibby has volunteered to head up a committee with the help of Lesley Bourque, Lorianne Sward, Linda Sprague, Debbie Rodriguez and Linda May.

Motion: Sue Leavitt, to accept the Sexual Abuse Policy as written.

Seconded: Ross Kerr Vote: unanimous

The Clerk will have a copy of the Sexual Abuse Policy included with the Annual Report. Sue Leavitt went over the Abuse Policy. Diane Hassman wanted to know who would be responsible for filling out the forms and keeping them updated. Sue thought that maybe two people, the Sunday School Super and the Moderator. It was suggested that it should be a three-year contract, using an expiration date. Ken May suggested that we vote on the policy and let Council work out the details of implementing it. Dorraine Parker said that we shouldn't accept it without knowing who will be in charge. We will be voting on accepting the policy and giving Council charge of how to implement it. These forms are meant for people who volunteer to help with children and for people who volunteer to minister the church. These forms will be kept confidential.

A discussion was held with the Core Group on what they have learned. Ken May spoke about were they stand right now. They have a meeting scheduled for February 21, 2004. We have received approval for \$1,500.00 from the Conference to offset the cost of the consultants. Bill Sward mentioned that they don't have any answers right now but they are working on it. Ross Kerr asked if they were at the point of knowing what the problems are. Members of the Core

Group said no. Dorraine said they are at the point of seeing all sides and all views of the people.

John Leavitt addressed the people about the Annual Pastoral Evaluation. He said that an Annual Evaluation is probably preferred and it should cover all positions and congregation dynamics. He said the Evaluation should not be so focused on the pastor. John also said that Pastoral Relations is not so much to fix things and we should be looking for another way to deal with problems. Pastoral Relations has proposed that we have a new committee consisting of one person from Pastoral Relations, one person from Trustees, one person from Deacons and one extra member, used to deal with staff issues. John said that if we make any changes that they be incorporated into the church constitution. A discussion was had and a question was asked if Pastoral Relations could be changed to try and help fix problems. John said that Pastoral Relations was like a buddy to the Pastor and can't really be the boss. It was also mentioned that constitutionally it looks like any problems with the Pastor should fall to the Deacons.

Motion: Ken May, to adopt the proposal made by Pastoral Relations.

Kay Myott wanted to know why we needed another committee when we already have Pastoral Relations. It was suggested that we should wait until we hear what the Core Group finds out. The motion was withdrawn after extensive discussion.

We had an average worship service attendance of 50.8 compared to 52.2 in 2003 and the Choir had an average of 5.4 members on the Sundays there was a choir, compared to 8.3 in 2003.

Disclosure Forms

Last year a committee was formed to develop a sexual abuse policy and the resulting policy and form was presented at the Annual Meeting in January 2004. It was decided these forms would be the responsibility of the Clerk and Sunday School Superintendent. They were handed out at the Sunday School teacher's meeting in August and have been completed by a majority of Sunday School teachers and substitutes, in addition to other members of the church family. A total of nineteen forms have been completed. These forms are valid for three years and will be kept confidential and a list of completed forms will be maintained by the Clerk.

Trustees

The Trustees in 2004, continued to work hard in upgrading our church facility making it a safe and enjoyable place to worship. The first item on our agenda was the electrical system within the church. We had it inspected by D'Amico Electric. The wiring although old is relatively safe. We followed their recommendations and corrected a circuit breaker within the service panel, and also upgraded the outlets in kitchen to GFCI outlets. In 2003 we purchased a new gas range. After monitoring the gas usage of the pilot lights and concern about pilot lights burning, in an unoccupied building, we decided to turn the gas to the range off at the outside tanks, when the stove wasn't being used. This decision will save us hundreds of dollars in gas and also keep the church a safer place.

We finally solved the problem of the bulbs on the cross burning out, prematurely, by installing a rheostat. The rheostat let us control the electrical current going to the bulbs. After much discussion and ideas on how to close the middle driveway, between the church and parish house, we decided to place orange highway cones to deter any traffic from using the driveway during church functions. Metal strips were also installed on the stairs leading up to the pulpit, making them visible and decreasing the likelihood of people tripping on the steps.

These items were the highlights of the year, and were accomplished at a small cost for supplies, thanks to the time and effort of the following church members: Don Lingley, Norm Lutzen, Jim Missell, Bill Sward, and Gordon Myott.

The investment committee did not meet this year, however the Trustees and the treasurer, have been keeping a watchful eye on our investments. Year after year the trustees are handed the task of overseeing the physical portion of the church, parish house and the grounds. Some things we have control over, alot of things we do not. I would like to thank the dedicated committee members and also all the volunteers that make our job that much easier.

Diaconate

What a year! The Diaconate met 12 times. January 2004 the deacons were Susan Leavitt, John Leavitt, Jackie Yeo, Lisa May, Don Sanger, Myrna Gambino, Gibby Paixo, and Suki Garrell. John Leavitt was voted Chair of Deacons. February 29th Kathy Bartholomew joined the church.

This year there were four confirmands: Greg Burns, Wayne Bourque, Jake Kowalshyn and Lauren Parker.

There was a Maundy Thursday Service April 8th. Twenty-eight Easter Lilies were sold to benefit the Campership fund.

In May, Mother's Day flowers were given out to all mothers in the church. William Sward, Jr. was baptized in May. In May, Rev. Wadsworth announced his leave of absence June 13th to September 13th. Also in May, Music Director James Tripoli announced his resignation. His last Sunday was to be June 13th.

The chairman presented Deborah Blood's name as a possible candidate for the interim. As she was available, competent, willing to come and knowledgeable of some recent events in the church, the Deacons voted unanimously to present her name to the Trustees to set up a covenant. Pastor Deborah Blood was signed as Interim Minister. Her contract was set for June 14 through September 12 2004.

John Leavitt and Susan Leavitt resigned from Deacons June 1 and moved their memberships to the inactive list. Jackie Yeo accepted the Chairmanship of Deacons. Billy Sward and Kathy Bartholomew joined the committee to fill the roster to eight Deacons.

June 11th a Send Off Potluck dinner for Rev. Wadsworth was held in Fellowship Hall. Despite desires to host a dinner

in honor of Jim Tripoli's generous and gifted music leadership in the church, Deacons respected his wish for a quiet farewell. Children's Sunday was also June 13th. A liturgy of farewell and release was held for both Rev. Wadsworth as he set out on his leave of absence, and for Jim Tripoli as he concluded his service as Musical Director.

As there was not yet a staffed Music Committee, Deacons arranged for organists June and July. We acknowledge with gratitude the talents of Lucille Sherman, Effic Beres, Saeah Lee, James Purnell, Nancy Parker and Sam Moody who together brought music to our worship Sundays.

In August a Communion Service was held at Sun Valley. Also in August Pastor Deb baptized Andrew and Julia Fitzgerald. September 4th Pastor Blood married Kevin Ladr and Rebecca Hartzke. September 12, Pastor Blood celebrated Rally Day. We thank Deborah Blood for her gracious, cheerful and able pastoral care of our congregation.

September 13th Rev. Wadsworth returned to the pulpit for his final weeks. A Farewell potluck dinner was held Oct. 9th in honor of Rev. Wadsworth. Diaconate arranged for supply pastors for October and November.

Finally, after Rev. Wadsworth announced his intention to resign as pastor of Second Congregational Church, deacons formed a sub-committee to Search for a long-term Interim Pastor. Jackie Yeo, Billy Sward, Gibby Paixo and Trustee Chairman Bill Hassman filled this sub-committee. After reviewing the possible candidates given by the Connecticut Conference of the U.C.C. and performing interviews, the committee voted unanimously to recommend Rev. Alice O'Donovan as Interim Pastor.

The Reverend Alice O'Donovan began as Interim Minister October 25.

Christmas poinsettias were sold by the Diaconate, with funds to benefit the campership fund. A Service of Prayer on the Longest Night was given on December 21st. Two Christmas Eve services were held, the first with music, stories and children, the second service was a Communion service.

January 4th Kathy Bartholomew resigned as Deacon.

The Deacon's Fund 2/01/04 was \$1,335.95. 1/12/05 balance was \$1,463.81.
